
## Funding Free Software Developers with...



## Why? Because Free Software Developers...

- Freely share the result of their work in a way that benefits the whole society.
- Need to pay their bills in order to continue doing what they do.
- → Since our societies haven't setup a "basic income" yet, we need a solution to fund free software developers.

### How can they earn money?

And why the current situation is not satisfying...

- Get hired → loss of independence
- Start consultancy → 80% support, 20% coding
- Donations → 80% marketing, 20% coding
- Lottery → 100% coding but 0,0000001% probability

→ With Librement, the goal is to achieve 80% coding with 20% of supporting activities

# Donations are great but raising money is hard

#### You need:

- An audience
- Marketing skills
- A donation form and a merchant account
- Transparent accounting to build confidence



## Librement's features (1/3) Multiple ways to earn money

- Donations (spontaneous, recurring, campaigns)
  - Effective donation forms
- Selling documentation
  - Easy publication (directly from DocBook sources)
- Selling support
  - Set your offers and manage the on-going contracts

## Librement's features (2/3) Build a global audience of donors

- One-shot donation forms embedded in many free software project websites should "funnel" donors towards...
- → A monthly donation split between all the projects and developers that the user supports.
- → And/or some opt-in e-mail subscription to keep him informed of future opportunities.

## Librement's features (3/3) Everything else that you want

- Librement is Free Software (AGPL 3.0+) and written in Python with Django:
  - http://github.com/rhertzog/librement/
- The best way to verify if a funding model works is to try it.
- Librement has been designed to be a collection of different services so that each free software developer/project can pick a subset that fit their specific case.
